A. Illegal dumping

- 1. The Problem
 - a. 2009 survey of the City of Pittsburgh identified 279 illegal dump sites in the city of Pittsburgh alone.
 - b. We believe that there are as many as 3 times that amount, many over hillsides, or on "paper" streets, not visible from the road.
 - c. A similar survey of Allegheny County in 2005 identified 202 illegal dump sites in Allegheny County outside of the city. We can assume that that number is also greatly under estimated
 - d. We currently have 706 surveyed sites in our database.
- 2. Definition of an illegal dump site: a spot where someone has deliberately brought a substantial quantity of debris to one spot to get rid of the material illegally.
- 3. Typical material that is dumped includes: Remodeling debris; Household trash and furniture; Landscaping debris; Roofing materials; Tires
- 4. The Cost
 - a. Economic Costs
 - Cleanup costs
 - an average of \$629* \$835** per ton
 - average cleanup cost was \$2,947 per site*
 - based on those numbers, the cost to clean up all of the 706 sites that we've identified so far in Allegheny County would be \$2,080,582

 Enforcement Officials
 - Real estate no exact numbers are known, but illegal dumping, like other forms of blight, has a significant effect on property value and lack of economic development and reinvestment. According to the 2013 Tri-COG study on the financial impact of blight
 - Indirect costs associated with loss of property value are estimated between \$218 and \$247 million
 - Indirect costs associated with the loss of real estate taxes due to a decline in property value is estimated to be between \$8,574,723 and \$9,718,019
 - The loss associated with lack of development and reinvestment is \$8,284,294 annually

 - e. Work job continuously (usually daily) until finished
 - Completion transformed the area as much as could possibly be done; looks the way it's "supposed" to be
 - Ready for next step (i.e. planting, gardening, trails informal or formal; stewardship)
 - **f.** Stewardship Process work with the community to develop stewardship plan to maintain the site and prevent repeat dumping
